You should be commended for the bridges you have crossed and the challenges you have overcome. It shows the courage, fight, and resilience each one of you had to endure, even though you may have had days that seemed so dark and filled with grey skies. These are traits of a growth mindset. A winning mindset. Something that will be your best friend as you continue throughout your life of living your truth and making a positive impact in the lives of others.

You know, one of the things I was asked to speak about today was to impart some good advice or share some inspiring message as you begin a new chapter in your life. Well as I mentioned earlier, I'm just 22 and I'm not sure if I could share a lot of good wisdom or advice because like you, I'm beginning a new journey too.

But here is the advice I will give you today in hope that, maybe just maybe it will help you navigate this wonderful journey called life...

BE TRUE TO YOURSELF AND EVERYTHING WILL BE JUST FINE.

And here is my inspiring message for you...

CHOSE LOVE, AND DON'T EVER LET FEAR TURN YOU AGAINST WHAT YOU KNOW IS RIGHT IN YOUR HEART.
