Project Scope	In this topic, we invite organisations to identify an appropriate 'Position Problem' as a project for teams of students to elaborate, execute and report back to you by the end of the semester. The project will involve tasks that add value to your organisation, and that have academic merit. For instance, projects could include tasks such as: document searching, retrieval and report writing; literature reviews/results and methods on a given issue; analysis of empirical evidence/literature review conducted previously by another researcher; researching best practice models in a particular area; setting up tools to evaluate a project or execution of evaluation; assisting with any ongoing research of interest to the agency.

Project Outcomes	<p>The student teams working on your organisation will produce two main pieces of work, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Final presentation: Students will detail their final research findings and strategic recommendations, and provide details on how they should be implemented.• Final report: Students will present a professional report outlining all stages of their project research and strategic recommendations.
