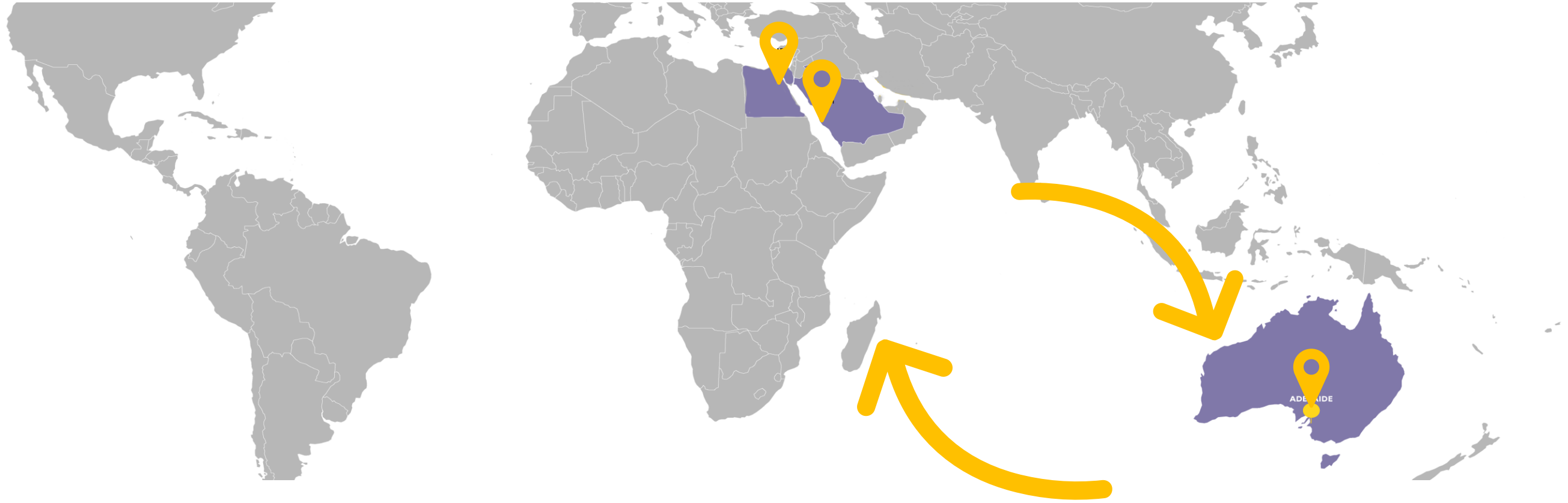


Multi-node Symposia for

Guidelines for Submission:

Word limit for abstract submissions is 300 words, which will be peer reviewed by two academics.

Written papers can be submitted after the conference and may be published in the proceedings of the symposium. Selected papers will be invited for possible publication in a special issue of a journal or an edited book.

Guidelines for Poster Submission:

Include title of the poster and abstract of up to 200 words explaining your research and the visual components, which will be peer reviewed by two academics.

The suggested size of the paper is size A1 or 594mm x 841mm (landscape or portrait orientation).
