In Kalgoorlie, the eGFR3 Study team learned about water quality and other health issues in the Goldfields. Jody Hansen (WACHS Regional Aboriginal Health Consultant) showcased the Renal Hostel, where people on dialysis can live while attending dialysis at Kalgoorlie Hospital. We saw the improvements at the Hospital aiming to make it more welcoming. Aboriginal art is used in flooring to help with directions to clinics and departments.

WA Country Health Service executive officers and clinicians, Bega Garnbirringu Health Service staff, Rural Clinical School and community leaders at Ngunytju Tjitji Pirni (NTP) welcomed the opportunity to talk about kidney health and the eGFR3 Study.

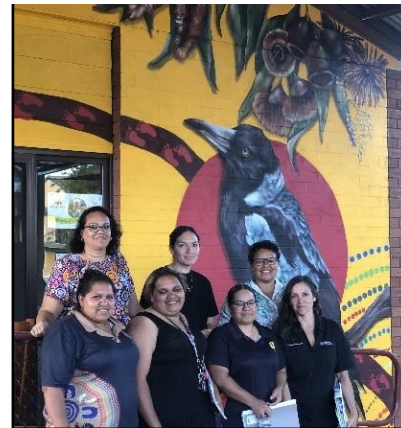

Communities share aspirations for self-determination, workforce development and the development of future leaders. The eGFR3 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Community Governance Group are developing processes to ensure that communities maintain sovereignty of research activities including level of participation and data collection, access and use.

After the success of the 2023 workshop on country in Waibene, the 2024 annual eGFR3 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Community Governance Group 3 day workshop will be hosted in Mparntwe. The focus in 2024 is on Indigenous Data Sovereignty in research.

Members continue to engage with government and non-government organisations and communities about kidney health and the eGFR3 Study.
