



The Margaret Brown Prize for Contribution to a Rural Community 2022

CRITERIA: Flinders University Rural and Remote Health South Australia (FRRHSA) annually awards The Margaret Brown Prize, to a graduating Doctor of Medicine (MD) student who has made a significant contribution to a South Australian (SA) rural community outside of their medical course curriculum requirements, and have completed a rural SA placement in an area away from their normal home or place of residence.

Any South Australian student enrolled in the Flinders University MD, independent of his/her site of study, is eligible for nomination. Nominations for the prize will be sought each year from students, members of the teaching staff and members of South Australian rural communities. Each nomination must include a statement of no more than 400 words describing the student's voluntary contribution to a rural community outside of their course.

The prize is named in honour of Margaret Brown, (AO) who has had significant involvement in rural community engagement and provided strong advocacy for rural health.
