

2019 Short Course

ADVANCED PRACTICUM IN MARITIME ARCHAEOLOGY



This short course will prepare participants and allow them to put their theoretical learning into practice, develop a sense of the workplace, enhance their career development through training and to build their professional network in marine archaeology.

Course Content

This short course is a practicum which provides participants with opportunities to participate in the workplace environment. Occasionally, maritime archaeology fieldwork opportunities arise in which participants may assist government agencies, consultancy firms, non-profit groups, or other universities. This short course provides participants with the ability to participate in these projects and receive one-on-one guidance and instruction with immediate feedback on their performance.

The body of the short course will comprise a practical in Inverloch, Victoria, to undertake the archaeological excavation of the Amazon ship—wrecked here in 1863. Students will work closely with our Industry Partner Heritage Victoria and the local community. The practicum will be spent in the field to acquire data and devoted to shipwreck excavation, interpretation and

reporting as would be expected in a professional environment.

Learning Outcomes

Participants should gain the following skills from this advanced practicum:

- Acquire practical and technical skills for conducting maritime archaeology fieldwork
- Gain an understanding for the legal and ethical responsibilities within this field
- Strengthen their professional relationships with current maritime archaeologists
- Develop an appreciation for working in team environment, acquiring the personal and professional attributes necessary to work with others to complete tasks.

Who should attend?

There are no prerequisites for this short course other than being over the age of 18 years. Moderate levels of fitness will be necessary for some components of
