Course Content

This highly interactive workshop aims to prepare and strengthen placement education to maximise work integrated learning experiences (WIL) for you, your organisation and students.

As part of this course you will:

- Explore the placement educator role in student learning
- Develop your understandings about teaching and learning
- Increase assessment knowledge and feedback skills
- Extend cultural awareness and communication strategies
- Understand how to facilitate challenging learners and contexts

Who should attend?

This short course is designed for placement educators who are involved in supporting students through placements, practicums and WIL.

Placement educators for Nursing and Midwifery are strongly encouraged to undertake this workshop every 3 years. Flinders University employed placement educators are unable to claim payment for attending this workshop but will receive a certificate of attendance.

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of Facilitating Clinical Learning, participants will be able to explore the role of the Registered Nurse in facilitating clinical learning, and further develop theory and practice underpinning clinical learning including:

- Contexts of clinical learning
- Learner characteristics
- Personal factors impacting learning
- Challenging students
- Assessment for learning
- Discuss strategies to assess and further develop clinical learning
- Develop skills in providing constructive feedback
- Understand the resources available for both students and staff to assist with students in the practice setting.
