POSITION SUMMARY
<p>Under general direction, the Senior Technical Officer (Team Leader) will provide services in a range of technical functions, including simulation activities, to support the programs of the College of Nursing &amp; Health Sciences at Flinders University City Campus. Under general direction the incumbent will use their wide range of clinical experience to ensure that workshop preparation and associated simulation equipment supports the learning requirements of students working in the Healthcare Simulation Laboratories in accordance with university course requirements. In addition, the position will provide functional supervision such as training, scheduling, task assignments, and checking on work performed by the Technical Officers team at Flinders University City Campus.</p>

### KEY POSITION RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Undertake the role of Team Leader of the Clinical Skills / Simulation Laboratories by coordinating the day-to-day activities and distribution of workloads as required and, in consultation with other Team Leaders and Senior Manager – Healthcare Simulation in other campuses, organise the reallocation of staff duties and workloads in the event of staff absence.
2. Plan and prepare the laboratory environment for clinical simulation workshops in accordance with university course requirements liaising when applicable with the Senior Manager – Healthcare Simulation, course coordinators, and academic and other laboratory staff.
3. Provide technical advice and assistance during practical classes including demonstration of simulation equipment, procedures and techniques as required and to ensure safe and effective operations.
4. Assume the functional responsibilities of other Team Leaders and Senior Manager in their absence.
5. Quality control of clinical laboratory setups with a student-centred focus.
6. Maintaining, monitoring and supervising stock control for smooth operation of all programs.
7. Plans, coordinates, and manages resources including rostering and local timetabling to ensure clinical skills laboratories activities are suitable and appropriate to the area and topic.
8. Ensuring a safe environment for staff and students by following WH&S requirements and ensuring that all equipment is appropriately checked, stored and maintained in accordance with relevant policy and legislation.
9. Coordinates and advises the development and maintenance of documents relating to laboratory student and staff safety.
10. Ensure that maintenance requirements of simulation laboratory equipment are followed in accordance with relevant policy and legislation.
11. Liaise and collaborate with manufacturers, industry partners and company representatives to ensure product support, maintenance and troubleshooting is managed with minimal impact to students' experience as well as to enhance the technical functions of the laboratories.
12. Collate, record, report and resolve Information Technology, Audio Visual and Simulation equipment faults to minimise interruption to student learning.
13. Any other responsibilities in line with the level of the role as assigned by the Supervisor and/or the University.

### KEY POSITION CAPABILITIES

- Qualification in Nursing / Midwifery / Health Science / Physiotherapy / Occupational Therapy or an equivalent combination of experience and/or education and training relevant to the position.
- Proven knowledge and experience in clinical health care settings encompassing all levels of patient acuity.
- Demonstrated experience with clinical teaching and assessment set up, including knowledge of and familiarity with equipment used for clinical teaching purposes.

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- Proven ability to work effectively in a team environment and to take a functional supervisory role within a team.
- Effective oral and interpersonal skills, including the ability to provide effective and appropriate information and advice to a wide range of staff and provide instructions to students.
- Effective written communication skills, and written communication skills, including the capacity to draft correspondence and respond to enquiries autonomously.
- Well-developed ability to plan and manage complex workflows with non-negotiable deadlines and to balance competing demands for resources during peak periods.
- Strong analytical and problem-solving skills and the ability to apply these skills to topic administration, rostering and timetabling.
- Previous experience and knowledge relating to all levels of clinical simulation in a university or teaching environment.
- Previous experience in a supervisory role an advantage.



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
