POSITION SUMMARY
<p>Under general to broad direction, the Financial Counsellor works in the Student Association to provide independent and confidential advocacy and welfare services to students. These services include the provision of a quality and comprehensive financial counselling service, administration of student loans, grants and emergency financial assistance and advice, support, and advocacy on a range of matters relating, but not limited, to the University's student related policies and procedures.</p>

KEY POSITION RESPONSIBILITIES

The Financial Counsellor is accountable for:

1. Providing a professional financial counselling service including assessment of student's financial situation, advice on budgeting, credit, bankruptcy, and other options to reduce financial stress.
2. Providing advocacy for students in financial hardship. Negotiate and advocate on behalf of students where appropriate ensuring they are represented in a professional manner.
3. Coordinating and administering University student loans, student grants and emergency financial assistance programs, including promotion, assessment, and approval of applications.
4. Providing advice, support, and advocacy services to students on a range of academic, administrative and financial matters, including Commonwealth Student Income Support payments and the University's student-related policies and procedures framework.
5. Maintaining accurate, timely and confidential client files and case-notes.
6. Working collaboratively with University staff, elected student representatives and external agencies to reach and effectively support students most in need.
7. Engaging in promotional activities for the service and work collaboratively with students to design and facilitate educative activities and programs that foster financial literacy and empower students.
8. Any other responsibilities in line with the level of the position as assigned by the Supervisor and/or the University.

KEY POSITION CAPABILITIES

1. A Diploma of Community Services (Financial Counselling) / Diploma of Financial Counselling and hold associate or full membership with SA Financial Counsellors Association (SAFCA) *or* currently working towards this qualification.
2. Some case management experience delivering a responsive and high-quality financial counselling service.
3. Demonstrated experience in providing advocacy support for a client group; or an equivalent combination of relevant experience and/or education/training.
4. Well-developed written communication skills, including the ability to communicate in a professional manner with creditors, external agencies, students and staff, and prepare submissions and reports.
5. Well-developed negotiation skills, including ability to listen, articulate a position, exercise sound judgement and utilise strong problem-solving skills.
6. Proven ability to use initiative, set priorities, and manage complex workflows and competing priorities.
7. Proven ability to work effectively in a team environment, and to work with a diverse range of individuals and groups.
8. Familiarity with a university environment, relevant University policies, Commonwealth legislation and Commonwealth student income support programs (*Desirable*).
