POSITION SUMMARY

Under general direction, the Community Researcher will provide support for the ARC Linkage project (Social prescribing: linking Australian social, health and community sectors). The project aims to co-design, implement, and evaluate social prescribing across the Onkaparinga and Marion Local Government Areas.

Working under routine supervision of the Chief Investigators, the Community Researcher will work in the community to identify and understand social and community service availability and potential gaps in current services provided. The Community Researcher will liaise across the health, social, and community sectors to support implementation and evaluation of services.

- Developing partnerships with organisations in local communities.
- Supporting and assisting with participant recruitment and relevant data collection.
- Providing a high level of administration support for research activities
- Any other responsibilities in line with the level of the position as assigned by the Supervisor and/or the University.
