#### **POSITION SUMMARY**

The Research Fellow role will undertake research in the Discipline of Trauma and Injury focusing on one of the Discipline's research projects: Transforming Health and Wellbeing\_Outcomes from Injury for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Children – The HEAL Cohort Study, under the broad supervision of the Chief Investigator. In working with the Chief Investigator and research team, the position will contribute to HEAL design, implementation, and analysis of data and the preparation of ethics and manuscripts for publication. The role will also engage with HEAL partner sites, and collaborators assisting to maintain stakeholder relationships.

The individual will also actively report on new and current research related to HEAL, through generation of appropriate publications and conference presentations. In addition, the position will contribute to public health community engagement, building industry and stakeholder relationships, preparation of applications for research funding with discipline colleagues and external partners, under the broad direction of the Chief Investigators. The role will have some supervisory responsibilities.

The Research Fellow in Injury and Trauma is accountable for:

- Actively contributing to HEAL by collaborating with the Research Team to successfully deliver project milestones and Key Performance Indicators.
- Independently contributing to the planning and execution of a large scale paediatric cohort study by offering new and innovative ideas, reviewing relevant literature and other sources of information, actively participating in the production of data, contributing to the writing and editing of grant applications and attending seminars, meetings and conferences.
- Participating planning and executing HEAL tasks required to collaborate with industry partners and key stakeholders.
- Establishing effective communicating channels (written and verbal), within project delivery teams, between partner sites teams and stakeholders, including Clinicians, Public Health Officers, Investigators, and other business and stakeholder representatives.
- Independently contribute to ethical, high quality and innovative research and evaluation as related to HEAL, through activities such as scholarship, publishing in recognised high quality journals and assisting the preparation and submission of bids for external research funding.
- Independently develop HEAL documentation, including information sheets, consent forms, ethics, governance applications, research contracts, relevant budgeting, study planning, education materials, presentations, other relevant applications, and contribute to HEAL protocol and reports.
- Development and maintenance positive relationships and communication of professional research service expertise to other service providers both external and across the University.
- Contributing to continuous improvement of project delivery standards, processes and procedures to be used throughout HEAL with partner organisations as applicable.
- Supervision of honours and post graduate research projects.
- Some out of hours work (including weekends) as well as rural SA, interstate and overseas travel, may be required.
- Any other responsibilities in line with the role level as assigned by the Supervisor and/or the University.
