

The Peter Torjul City Campus Scholarship



Flinders University has established this scholarship to support students studying at our City Campus. The scholarship is named to honour the late Peter Torjul, who worked tirelessly for over 30 years to create educational pathways for students to Flinders.

Up to ten scholarships will be available per annum.

Eligibility

Scholarship applicants must meet the following criteria:

- be an Australian or New Zealand citizen, permanent resident of Australia or permanent humanitarian visa holder; and
 - be applying via SATAC to commence an undergraduate degree at Flinders' City Campus; and
 - be in receipt of means-tested government payments, or can demonstrate financial hardship, or be from a Low SES school*; and
- be completing year 12 in the year prior to commencing University study. *Eligible high schools and courses will be published on the scholarship's pages of the University's website.

This scholarship cannot be held concurrently with other major University scholarships.

Benefits

The scholarship is valued at \$7,500 per annum for up to three years. The scholarship will be paid in instalments of \$3,750 each semester, subject to the recipient maintaining eligibility.

Tenure

The scholarship is awarded for the published duration of the course up to a maximum of three years. The scholarship is not transferable to another course.

Recipients must:

- be enrolled at Flinders' City Campus in an undergraduate course; and
- normally be enrolled full-time, and
- be making satisfactory academic progress.

Recipients who have extenuating circumstances that prevent them from studying full-time (e.g. disabilities, illness, or carer responsibilities) may apply to hold their scholarship part-time subject to the provision of satisfactory independent documentation.

Selection

Selection will be awarded based on academic merit, using the applicant's university entrance score. Selection of the candidate(s) will be made at the same time as the main round of university admission offers in accordance with procedures approved by the Director, Student Administration Services and based on SATAC application data. If the scholarship quota is not filled in the first main round of offers, the University may decide to offer scholarships to students in subsequent rounds. (Note, the main round is usually the first offer round held in the January of the admission year).

Applications

An application for an eligible course will constitute an application for the scholarship.
