

Purpose

The College of Business, Government and Law has established the Indigenous Research Honours Scholarship to promote reconciliation by furthering understanding and recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures, histories, knowledge and rights through related research projects.

Source of funds

The scholarships are funded by the College of Business, Government and Law and will continue whilst there is sufficient funding.

Benefits

Each scholarship will have a value of \$5000 paid in equal instalments after the census date of each semester. The number of scholarships will depend on the funding available.

Eligibility

Applicants must:

- be currently completing or have completed an undergraduate degree; and
- be accepted into an Honours program, or the final 36 units of a four year Honours program in the College of Business, Government and Law at Flinders University in the areas listed above for the specified academic year; and
- commencing an Honours research project in one or more of the five critical dimensions identified by Reconciliation Australia: race relations; equality and equity, institutional integrity; unity; and historical acceptance.

Applications

Applications will be accepted each semester and can be made online through the Student Management System.

Tenure

The scholarship is available for one year. Payments will be made subject to satisfactory progress. Scholarship payments will be withdrawn if the recipient withdraws or is precluded from the course and will not be available for a repeat year of study.

Leave

No leave is permitted.

Selection

The Scholarship will be awarded based on:

- academic merit; and

- the relevance and quality of the proposed Honours research project.

Selection will be made by a Committee within the College of Business, Government and Law.

Advertising

The scholarship will be advertised on the University website and other appropriate media as determined by Flinders University.
