OVERVIEW

Flinders' diploma-level qualifications provide flexible, supported study options in a wide range of study areas. Diploma students will access a range of benefits, such as:

- a pathway to most Flinders degrees (based on your academic performance in the Diploma)
- access to a supported learning environment via established student success programs
- experiencing uni life as a Flinders student
- up to one year of credit towards a range of Bachelor degrees.

Diploma students can participate in a recommended two-week intensive 'UniLIFT' program, designed to help commencing university students refine their academic writing skills and learn about Flinders' continued support services throughout their university study.

WHAT YOU WILL STUDY

The Diploma in Arts provides students with a broad range of disciplinary and interdisciplinary studies from across the University, with a focus on aspects of human culture and achievement.

Students may undertake topics from a range of disciplines including: American Studies, Applied Linguistics, Archaeology, Biological Sciences, Business Studies, Creative Writing, Criminology, Drama, Earth Sciences, English, French, Geography and Environmental Studies, History, Indigenous and Australian Studies, Indonesian, Innovation and Enterprise, Information Technology, International Affairs, International Relations, Italian, Law and Society, Mathematics, Modern Greek, Physical Education, Philosophy, Politics, Professional Studies, Psychology, Public Policy, Sciences, Screen and Media, Sociology, Spanish, Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics, Visual Arts and Women's Studies.

FURTHER STUDY OPTIONS

The Diploma of Arts articulates with the Bachelor of Arts, for which students can apply for up to one year of credit, allowing students to complete the Bachelor of Arts within an additional 2 years (or part-time equivalent).

Students can also apply for up to one year of credit towards other Bachelor degree courses upon admission.

On successful completion of the Diploma, students will be guaranteed entry to the following courses:
