Bachelor of Early Childhood Education (Birth - 8)

This degree seeks to equip graduates with the skills to implement considered and purposeful experiences that cultivate young children's play, learning and development in the twenty-first century.

- You'll qualify to work with children in early childhood and early primary school settings.
- You'll gain rich experience with 90 placement days, working in a range of birth-8 settings.
- Personalise your degree by choosing a specialist curriculum area and multiple elective options.

Bachelor of Education (Primary)

Through a dynamic course of study integrated with professional practice, this future-focused degree empowers graduates to bring together knowledge, skills, mind and context to inspire and educate young minds.

- Learn to create supportive, safe and enriching learning environments and make a positive difference in the lives of students.
- Gain professional experience by undertaking placements in primary schools.
- Develop expertise and confidence to teach innovative STEM education.

Bachelor of Education (Secondary)

Teachers are no longer content-specific delivery agents. This course acknowledges this reality and emphasises teaching to promote engaged learning with further active, experiential, authentic, 'hands on' learning both at the individual and collaborative level.

- Develop the knowledge and skills required to start a career as a teacher in secondary school.
- Graduate work-ready, with teaching placements in secondary schools providing the opportunity to learn practical skills, put theory into practice and develop important relationships with students, parents and colleagues.

Bachelor of Education (Secondary Health and Physical Education)

This degree not only offers exceptional training for future health and physical educators in school settings, but responds to demand for highly trained educators from the sports, recreation and outdoor education industries.

- You'll major in physical education or health education, minor in the other, and be able to elect a second minor to increase employment opportunities.
- You can undertake professional experience placements in secondary schools, where you can learn practical skills and put theory into practice.
- Your placements will help you to develop and consolidate your teaching knowledge and skills in order to meet the necessary national standards for registration as a teacher.

Bachelor of Inclusive and Specialised Education (Early Childhood, Primary and Secondary)

In this degree, you will graduate with the agency and confidence to apply and adapt your knowledge and skills across a range of contexts, working effectively with the full range of learners in contemporary schools.

- Learn to create inclusive, specialised and challenging curriculum, using technology and teaching skills to extend all students.
- Become confident advocates for all learners to achieve high-quality and equitable outcomes, for students and their families.
- Get work-ready with professional experience placements in schools and/or early childhood settings, where you can learn practical skills, put theory into practice and develop important relationships with students, parents and colleagues.

Bachelor of Sport and Active Recreation*

This degree will see you graduate with the skills to become an effective professional in sport and physical activity careers, giving you a wide knowledge base in areas including health, tourism, nutrition, disability and business.**

In the first instance, think about how you would like to work with your areas of interest and expertise with the children in your class. Early childhood and primary teachers work with the whole curriculum but stay with a particular group of children for the year. Secondary teachers specialise in subject areas, often working with a larger number of students. Special education teachers work across these contexts but also have a very specific skill set to support their work with adolescents in the secondary setting. teaching

Fees and charges

As an undergraduate student your course is Commonwealth supported provided you're an eligible Australian citizen, New Zealand citizen or permanent resident. Starting at Flinders

When can I start?

Flinders offers two admissions cycles each year for undergraduate degrees. Semester 1 starts in March. If you've decided to take a break from schooling, you may decide to start mid-year in Semester 2, which starts in July. Note that not all degrees offer a Semester 2 start, so check the relevant course page via:

Admission Pathways

Whether you are a school leaver or returning to study at a later date, there are many ways to gain admission to Flinders University. Explore your options and find the entry path that's right for you.

Year 12 entry

Most Year 12 applicants enter university via the traditional entry method, where offers are made to eligible applicants with the highest selection rank until all places in the degree are filled. flinders.edu.au/year12

Guaranteed entry

If you achieve an ATAR equal to or above the published guaranteed entry selection rank (and you meet course prerequisites) you will be guaranteed a place at Flinders for most courses.

Year 12 Grades Entry Scheme

Upon SACE completion, by using three of your best Year 12 grades, you can gain a place in your course of choice. This is in addition to being considered on any other pathway for which you are eligible.

Indigenous Admission Scheme

The Indigenous Admission Scheme provides an alternative pathway for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. Visit:

Elite Athlete Pathway
