Flinders support

We approach our services to students in the same way that we approach our academic and research activities - with a commitment to excellence.

Students who are new to Australia may need some extra support to acclimatise and start their studies confidently. We have a range of support services and resources to help you transition to a new environment:

International Student Services (ISS)

ISS offers a range of programs supporting your enrolment, study and social life, as well as a referral service to facilities on campus and within the local community. ISS also offers a free meet-and-greet service for new international students arriving at Adelaide Airport, the railway station, or the central bus station.

Orientation

We have several orientation sessions and programs to help you get used to University life, including the Introductory Academic Program (IAP) for Australia Awards Scholars, the Flinders International Student Orientation and academic preparation programs.

Student Contact Officers (SCO)

The Student Contact Officers are situated within ISS. They are responsible for coordinating the non-academic aspects of the students' scholarships, including: reception on arrival, the payment of your Contributions to Living Expenses (CLE), assistance in finding accommodation, support services for families and access to health, academic and counselling services for students and their families.

Student Learning Support Service

The Student Learning Support Service (SLSS) offers support to all students in the areas of academic writing, basic mathematics, general study skills, and referencing. We offer one-to-one guided drop-in study support through the Learning Lounge (in-person at Bedford Park), online study support through Studiosity, programs to improve your academic skills, and a wide range of study resources accessible anytime through Flinders Learning Online (FLO). We also organise the English for Academic Purposes program - free modules to improve your academic English.

Flinders Connect

The Flinders Connect team can assist you with enquiries relating to enrolments, ID cards, parking permits and a range of other general enquiries. Finders Connect is available face-to-face on campus, as well as by phone or online.

Health, Counselling & Disability

Managing your health is important. We have facilities and services available to help you look after your physical and mental health. The university health service is a fully equipped and accredited medical centre providing a wide range of medical and disability services. There is also a free and confidential counselling service, which assists students who may be experiencing difficulties which impact their studies.

Oasis

Oasis, which can be found on the Bedford Park campus, is our Student Community Wellbeing Centre focused on supporting the physical, emotional, social, and spiritual needs of students, so they can achieve academic and personal success. We call it "Wellbeing for Success". A welcoming home away from home. A space to make friends, relax, or join in with one of many activities Oasis offers, such as yoga, meditation or community market. Oasis also has prayer rooms and quiet spaces. They also run English Chat groups for students, spouses and carers. They have a fully equipped kitchen to heat your lunch, join in a cooking demonstration or simply make a cuppa.

Families & Schooling

Students are responsible for all matters and costs associated with bringing family members to Australia. The South Australian government grants

fee-free education to the dependents of Australia Awards scholarship holders when their children attend state government schools. Australia Awards scholars are eligible to apply for the Child Care Subsidy to help offset the cost of childcare.
