The largest shopping centre in Adelaide located near Flinders' Bedford Park campus with over 300 stores.





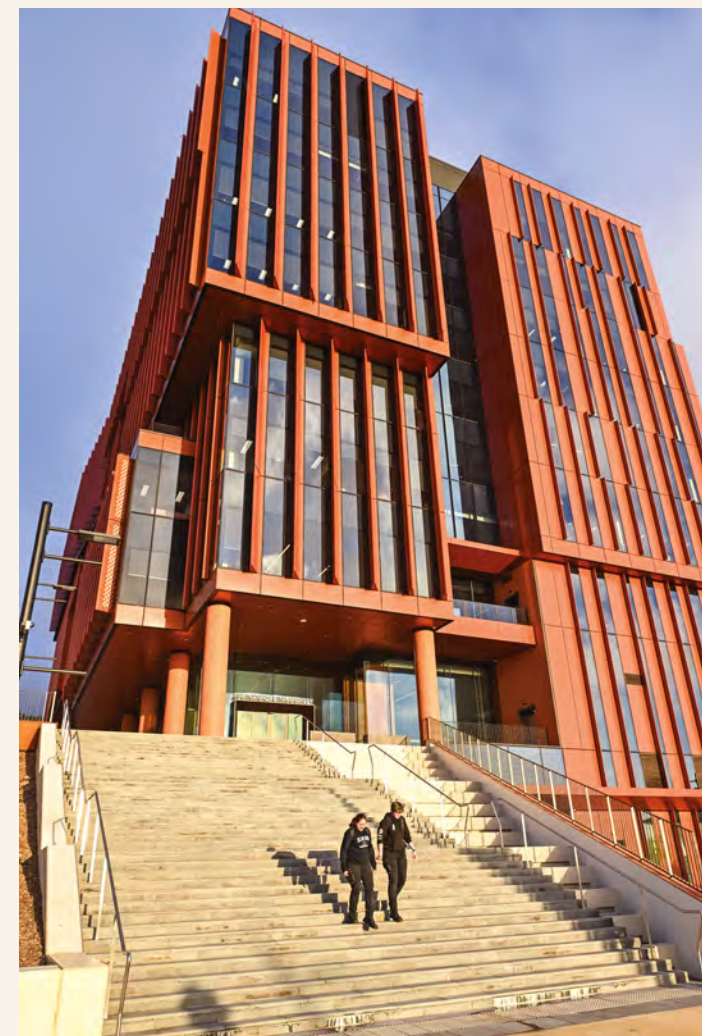
Flinders HealthCARE Centre

Tonsley

Explore Flinders’ Tonsley campus
– a \$120 million centre of innovation.

It’s a place where collaboration and entrepreneurial spirit combine to create the products and processes of the 21st century.

Flinders University’s Tonsley campus brings together teaching and research in computer science, engineering and mathematics in one central location. It has more than 150 staff, around 2,000 students, and a large 2,000-square-metre facility designed for heavy engineering equipment.

The New Venture Institute (NVI), based at both Tonsley and Bedford Park, connects students, businesses, government and the community, helping you build skills and networks for innovation and entrepreneurship.

Tonsley has strong links with industry, giving students valuable real-world experiences and connections. The campus is shared with leading local and international companies, including Siemens. It is also home to major research centres such as the Medical Device Research Institute, the Centre for Nanoscale Science and Technology, and the Factory of the Future - Australia’s first large-scale advanced manufacturing accelerator.

The Tonsley campus is conveniently located between the main Bedford Park campus and Adelaide city. It takes about 5 minutes to travel by car, 15 minutes by bus, or 30 minutes to walk from Bedford Park.

A \$141 million extension of the Flinders rail line connects both campuses, allowing travel between Tonsley and Bedford Park in just 2 minutes, and reaching Adelaide’s city centre in about 22 minutes.

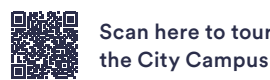

Make a difference with research that matters.

Whether you want to explore a topic more deeply, create new knowledge or become an expert in your field, a higher degree by research at Flinders will help you to make a difference.

A higher degree by research (HDR) is a PhD or Masters by Research. Work with highly qualified and recognised supervisors connect with industry, government and the community, and contribute to the global research conversation. Higher degrees by research transform lives, opening you up to new opportunities and making an impact with new discoveries.

Higher degrees by research provide training to foster the development of independent research and critical thinking skills. Acquiring these skills demonstrates your ability to pursue scholarly research that answers significant questions.

Cotutelles

Cotutelle doctoral degrees allow higher degree by research students an opportunity to experience an extended overseas research stay for one third of their candidature and obtain a joint PhD in the process.

Pathways

Flinders University has a range of pathways to help you enter a higher degree by research, including a Bachelor Honours Degree (Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) Level 8), relevant evidence of research skills and preparedness or Masters by Research.

Scholarships

A range of Flinders and Australian Government higher degree by research scholarships are available. These scholarships are awarded on academic merit and research potential.

Industry engagement

Flinders University offers higher degree by research students opportunities to engage with industry and research end-users through short-term internships. These can be undertaken locally, nationally or internationally as part of their studies.

South Australia has a Mediterranean climate, with long, hot summers and cool to cold, snowless winters.

Getting around

Adelaide is very easy to explore. You’ll quickly discover that the city is well serviced by public transport, and as an international student, you’ll receive the same transport concessions as local students, saving you up to \$700 per year on transport costs. Free tram and bus services run in the Adelaide city centre.

Buses run frequently to and from Flinders University and the adjacent Flinders Medical Centre, with various routes running directly from the city and suburbs. Adelaide is also cycling-friendly, with a large community of cyclists and dedicated bike lanes.

Like to shop? Adelaide has a wide range of retail outlets. Westfield Marion, the biggest shopping mall in Adelaide, is located just 10 minutes from our Bedford Park campus. Rundle Mall, located in the city centre, offers department stores and high street brands, while café-lined Rundle Street is home to designer labels.

Food

If you love great food, you’ll love Adelaide. The city is full of stunning cafés and restaurants. South Australia is well known for producing high-quality produce, from fresh fruit and vegetables through to the finest meat and seafood.

The city is also close to high quality produce regions, such as the Barossa Valley and McLaren Vale. Adelaide is a multicultural city that caters to vegan, vegetarian, Halal and Kosher requirements.

Health Insurance

Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) is compulsory for international students. If you are bringing dependents, you must purchase family cover. - successfully completed a pre-course English program from an approved ELICOS provider (evidence of completion must be no more than two years old on the proposed date of commencement for most courses).

4. ACCEPT your offer and make payment

Your offer letter will include details on how to accept your offer by completing the Offer Acceptance form and associated declarations. You will also be required to pay the relevant tuition fees for the first semester and the Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for the duration of your student visa, as detailed in your offer of admission. Ensure you read your offer letter carefully as it may include important deadlines for accepting your offer or deadlines for payment of fees to secure your place in the course.

5. RECEIVE your Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE)

We will issue a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) upon receipt of the signed acceptance, review of the declaration(s) and payment of fees, including OSHC. With the CoE you can apply for your student visa. Please check your visa requirements at homeaffairs.gov.au

6. APPLY for your student visa

The Student Visa (subclass 500) is a temporary visa that allows you to live, work and study an eligible course in a recognised education institution in Australia.

On receipt of your Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE), you may apply for a student visa.

7. ORGANISE your pre-departure arrangements after receiving your visa

8. ARRIVE in Australia and start your studies at Flinders

Once you arrive in Adelaide, South Australia, our team is here support you at every step of the way. Our International Student Services (ISS) team will contact you with a Welcome Guide and an arrival checklist to help you get settled in with your studies and new life in Adelaide.
