About the Jeff Bleich Centre

The Jeff Bleich Centre for Democracy and Disruptive Technologies (JBC) is a research centre in the College of Business, Government and Law, Flinders University.

The JBC recognises that democratic values and institutions need strengthening in order to flourish in democratic societies. It also recognises the disruptive nature of some technological advances, including the positive social impact that some of these technologies can facilitate, as well as the misuses that can undermine public trust and democratic values and processes. The Centre is named after Jeffrey Bleich, former U.S. Ambassador to Australia appointed by President Obama in 2009. Ambassador Bleich serves as Chairman of the JBC Advisory Board.

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Flinders University proudly acknowledges the Traditional Owners and Custodians of the lands on which our campuses are located. 2025 at a Glance

In early 2025, the Jeff Bleich Centre hosted a South Australian federal election conversation, and provided expert commentary on the ongoing effects of multiple rounds of Donald Trump's tariffs.



Federal Election Event

The JBC and the Australian Institute of International Affairs SA held an expert panel on Surviving Fragmentation: Geopolitics and the 2025 Australian Election, with expert speakers Professor Rodrigo Praino, Leonard Blazeby and Dr Nathan Gray.



100 Days of Trump Event

The JBC joined the American Chamber of Commerce in Australia in hosting an insightful breakfast assessing the first 100 days of the Trump presidency. Our experts – direct from Washington DC and from Adelaide – examined the key policies, economic shifts, and global implications of the new administration.



Aus Space 25 Sydney

Professor Rodrigo Praino participated in Space Connect's Australian Space Summit and Exhibition AusSpace 25 in Sydney, joining a panel on international collaboration and AUKUS with Doug Abdiel, Mark Ramsey, and Dan Lloyd.

We continued our meaningful work shaping global policy discussions, through the inaugural JBC Distinguished Lecture and co-hosting the Australian Space Cyber Forum.



JBC Distinguished Lecture

The Jeff Bleich Centre welcomed The Hon. Malcolm Turnbull AC, Australia's 29th Prime Minister, to deliver its inaugural Distinguished Lecture, "Surviving the New World Disorder."

He examined global challenges, Australia's sovereignty, and its strategic alliances. Following the lecture, he joined Ambassador (ret.) Jeff Bleich, Dr Maryanne Kelton and Professor Rodrigo Praino for a panel discussion on world affairs, moderated by Daniela Ritorto.



Australian Space Cyber Forum

The Jeff Bleich Centre once again co-hosted the Australian Space Cyber Forum with CyberOps and Agora High-Tech. The event featured a workshop, business dinner, symposium, and exhibition. Now in its third year and the largest space cyber event in the Southern Hemisphere, it attracted hundreds of Australian and international participants. Opening keynote speakers included The Hon. Stephen Mullighan, Enrico Palermo, Lieutenant General Michelle McGuinness, and Ambassador (ret.) Jeff Bleich.



Defence Leaders Breakfast

Professor Rodrigo Praino participated in the Defence Leaders Breakfast, hosted by the Defence Teaming Centre. He joined James Palmer of Silentium Defence for a discussion, with contributions from Molly Donohue Magee and Abraham Denmark.

The Centre finished the year by contributing to the Australian American Leadership Dialogue alongside senior political leaders, and the inaugural Active Citizenship Convention with over 1,500 young participants.



Australian American Leadership Dialogue

The JBC contributed to the 2025 Australian American Leadership Dialogue Forum, which brought more than 260 Australian and U.S. leaders to Adelaide to strengthen the Alliance in a challenging global environment.

Professor Rodrigo Praino and Ambassador Jeff Bleich contributed to discussions on democracy, diplomacy and leadership. The Centre also hosted an exclusive Parliament House dinner featuring prominent speakers including The Hon Milton Dick MP, Speaker of the Australian House of Representatives, and The Hon Michael Steele, former Lieutenant Governor of Maryland.

At the Governor's Leadership Foundation "Takes on Democracy" Winter event, Professor Rodrigo Praino delivered the keynote address, exploring the challenges facing democracy and the opportunities for renewal in South Australia and beyond.



Active Citizenship Convention

The Jeff Bleich Centre played a major role in the inaugural Active Citizenship Convention: Our Voice, Our Impact, a three-day event that brought together 1,500 Year 10 students from across South Australia to explore democracy and civic participation. Delivered in partnership with the Department for Education, the program featured workshops, keynote presentations, and panel discussions with leading civic and political figures. Dr Nick Bordeleau was a standout contributor, earning the unofficial title of “Democracy Legend” among attendees.



State Practitioner Network Investment Roundtable

Professor Rodrigo Praino spoke at the Economic Development Australia SA State Practitioner Network Investment Roundtable, alongside Chris Wood, Executive Director of Invest SA, exploring South Australia’s place in an evolving geopolitical landscape.



The Impacts of Colonialism Through Storytelling

Professor Marinella Marmo hosted an event exploring the lasting impacts of colonialism through personal experience and political reflection, centred on *The Chosen Son* by Professor Leanne Weber. The discussion featured Professor Leanne Weber, Michelle Gissara, and Dr Jared Thomas, examining how contemporary laws and policies continue to shape the lives of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

Visiting Researchers and Appointments



The **Fulbright Don DeBats Distinguished Chair in Politics and Public Policy** attracts distinguished American academics to undertake collaborative research at the Jeff Bleich Centre.

Professor Aaron Fellmeth is a leading expert in public international law, international business transactions, and intellectual property law. While at the Jeff Bleich Centre, Aaron researched states' obligations under International Human Rights Law with respect to private gun violence.

The Jeff Bleich Centre welcomed Dr Nick Bordeleau as a Research Fellow in 2025, following his successful visiting fellowship with the Centre in March and April 2024.

Nick's research investigates the role of citizens in democratic stability and decline, with particular attention to support for illiberal parties and candidates, public acceptance of democratic backsliding, and the influence of misinformation and conspiracy beliefs. Nick's appointment deepened the Centre's expertise in political behaviour, democratic resilience and the challenges facing contemporary democracies.



The Jeff Bleich Centre hosted Professor Erik Herron of West Virginia University as a visiting researcher in early 2025.

A leading scholar of comparative politics, Professor Herron specialises in political institutions and electoral systems, with extensive research and practical experience in election observation, democratic development and post-communist politics. During the visit, Professor Herron contributed this expertise to a collaborative JBC research project investigating elections and ballot design.

Our Programs

The JBC plays an active role in training a new generation of researchers and building capacity in Australia within areas of vital importance for our democracy.

Washington Internship

The Washington Internship Program (WIP) runs for 8 weeks (January-February), with an alternative 17-week program – combining the Washington Internship Program with a Capital Semester Program (WIPCASP) also available (January-May).

This Flinders program is the largest in Washington run by any university outside the United States. Students work full-time in the office of a member of the U.S. Senate or the U.S. House of Representatives.

In 2025, we supported 5 students to intern on Capitol Hill: Alyce Ferme, Clint Morin, Jameson Henderson-Redden, Preston Natale and Hillary Thursby.

Vienna Space Internship

Students spend up to 8 weeks in the charming city of Vienna where they discover how law and policy can impact human activity in space, with an opportunity to sit in on meetings at the United Nations Office for Outer Space Affairs. The internship takes place at the European Space Policy Institute (ESPI) headquarters in Vienna, where students explore space law and policy issues.

This year, two Flinders students, Claire Wilson and Ellie Fox, represented the JBC in Vienna as the second cohort of the program.

Innovations Incubator

The Innovations Incubator is the JBC's internal internship program, allowing students to gain research training by working alongside JBC researchers on active projects. This program is available to Flinders University undergraduate and postgraduate students throughout the year.

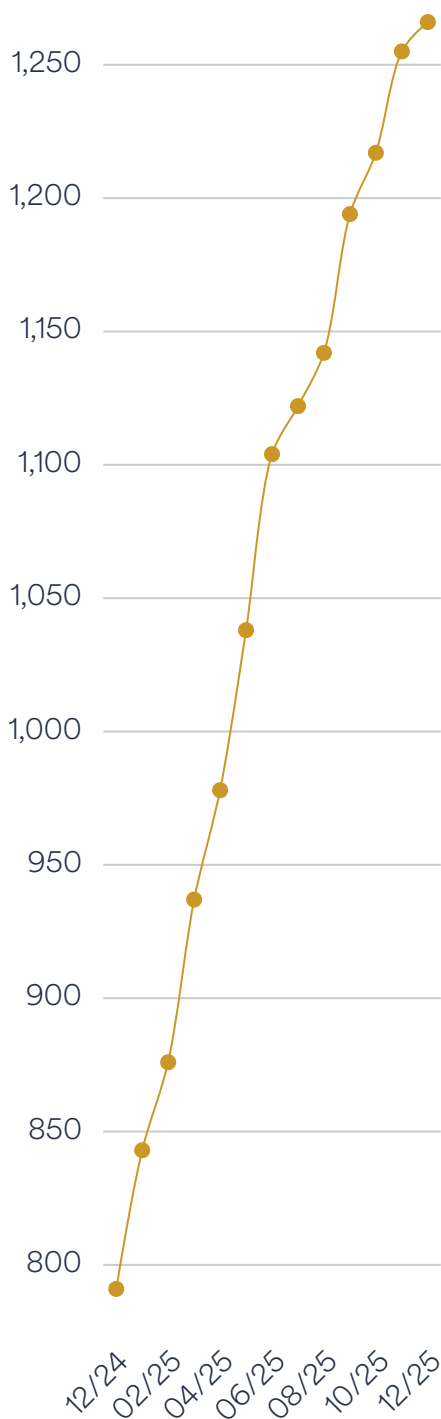

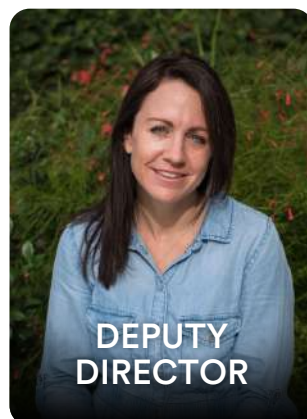

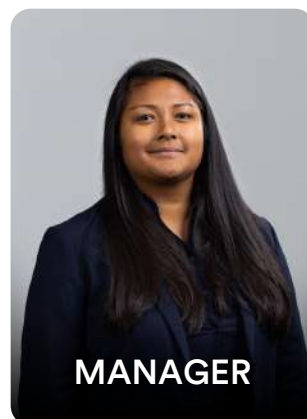
