This project aims to gather grouped information to inform organisations such as the Human Rights Commission of the magnitude of the problem of assistance dog refusals. The information will also be used in journal publications, presentations, and reports on this issue.

Benefits of the study

The sharing of your experiences will help to raise awareness of assistance dog refusals among those who have not experienced it personally and do not fully understand the barriers such refusals pose.

Participant involvement and potential risks

If you agree to participate in the research study, you will be asked to use the Paws Rights app and agree to your data to be pooled into a group dataset. You may be approached for participation in later research.

The researchers do not expect the questions to cause any harm or extra discomfort to you beyond what you will feel already from being refused access. You may, without any penalty, decline to take part in this research study. If you decide to take part and later change your mind, you may, without any penalty, withdraw at any time without providing an explanation. Any data collected up to the point of your withdrawal will be securely destroyed.

Confidentiality and Privacy

Only researchers listed on this form have access to the individual information provided by you. Privacy and confidentiality will be assured at all times. The research outcomes may be presented at conferences, written up for publication or used for other research purposes as described in this information form. However, the privacy and confidentiality of individuals will be protected at all times. You will not be named, and your individual information will not be identifiable in any research products without your explicit consent.

No data, including identifiable, non-identifiable and de-identified datasets, will be shared or used in future research projects without your explicit consent.

Data Storage

The information collected may be stored securely on a password protected computer and/or Flinders University server throughout the study. Any identifiable data will be de-identified for data storage purposes unless indicated otherwise. All data will be securely transferred to and stored at Flinders University for five years after publication of the results. Following the required data storage period, all data will be securely destroyed according to university protocols.

On project completion, a short summary of the outcomes will be provided to all participants via the email you provided when you use the Paws Rights app.

Ethics Committee Approval
