Description of the study

This study is part of the project titled: Grey Nomads with Diabetes – Self-management and medication management on the road. This survey will investigate Grey Nomads with diabetes and their experiences on the road in their self-management. Purpose of the study

Will I be identifiable by being involved in this study?

We do not need your name and you will be anonymous when completing the survey. Any identifying information will be removed from the survey and your comments will not be linked directly to you. All information and results obtained in this study will be stored in a secure way, with access restricted to relevant researchers.



Are there any risks or discomforts if I am involved?

The researcher anticipates few risks from your involvement in this study, however, given the nature of the project, some participants could experience emotional discomfort.
