גלעד צוקרמן הוא פרופסור לבלשנות באוניברסיטת קווינסלנד, ובעל תואר דוקטור מאוניברסיטת אוקספורד וקיימברידג'. פרסם מאמרים וספרים ביותר מעשר שפות. זהו ספרו הראשון שרואה אור בישראל.
